
### "From Stanton to Steinem and Beyond"

This original work was begun in 1978-9 by a group of American Association of University Women in Colorado Springs. Ann Hair, leader of the original group, updated the work, directed and read with the help of other women from the UU Church in Hot Springs, the UU Church in Hot Springs Village and the Hot Springs/Hot Springs Village Branch of AAUW. It was a very powerful and timely update to the struggle that women have faced throughout history in the world, and in our country specifically. It was educational and informative about the fight for women's rights in every sector of our society, how old a struggle it is, the social context which makes the struggle necessary and finally, what women might have to offer as alternatives in an uncertain future. If you missed it, look for another venue in our area as I know they are planning for repeat performances. It is a powerful message and the women who deliver it do an outstanding job with their roles.

Following from this premise, it sets forth a provocative "alternative" history of the world that is as compellingly readable as any novel. **Destiny Disrupted** won the Northern California Book Award for Best General Nonfiction of 2009, and it has been translated into nine

languages, including Russian, Dutch, Indonesian, Korean, and Italian.

"It's one of those "fascinating new fact every paragraph" books. Would you like to know how the Shiite-Sunni schism happened? It's all here. Rumi the poet? He's here. Empires, sultanates, wars, atrocities, cities of great beauty now lost forever, the whole deal. Even the chapters on theology are enjoyable, and I'm not big on the minutiae of belief systems."





### Subliminal: How Your Unconscious Mind Rules Your Behavior

### Winner of the 2013 PEN/E.O. Wilson Literary Science Writing Award



Over the past two decades of neurological research, it has become increasingly clear that the way we experience the world--our perception, behavior, memory, and social judgment--is largely driven by the mind's subliminal processes and not by the conscious ones, as we have long believed. As in the bestselling The Drunkard's Walk: How Randomness Rules Our Lives, Leonard Mlodinow employs his signature concise, accessible explanations of the most obscure scientific subjects to unravel the complexities of the subliminal mind. In the process he shows the many ways it influences how we misperceive our relationships with family, friends, and business associates: how we misunderstand the reasons for our investment decisions: and how we misremember important events--along the way, changing our view of ourselves and the world around us.

# 4th Friday Movie Night

#### "Calendar Girls"

### April 24th - Dinner at 6pm and movie at 7pm

When Annie Clarke's husband John dies from leukemia at an early age, her close friend Chris Harper, anxious to purchase a comfortable sofa for the visitors' lounge in

the hospital where he was treated, hits upon the idea of printing a calendar featuring some of the members of the Knapely branch of the Women's Institute discreetly posing nude while engaged in traditional WI activities, such as baking and knitting, in order to raise funds. Her proposal initially is met with great skepticism, but she eventually convinces ten women to participate in the project with her. They enlist one of the hospital workers, an amateur photographer named Lawrence, to help them with the concept.

Starring an ensemble cast headed by Helen Mirren and Julie Walters, with Linda Bassett, Annette Crosbie, Celia Imrie, Penelope Wilton, and Geraldine James playing key supporting roles, the film garnered generally positive reactions by film critics, and at a budget of \$10 million it became a major success, eventually grossing \$96,000,000 worldwide following its theatrical release in the United States.<sup>[1]</sup> In addition, the picture was awarded



by the British Comedy Award for Best Comedy Film, and spawned ALFS Award Empire Award, Satellite Award and Golden Globe nominations for Mirren and Walters respectively.<sup>[3]</sup>
