

Following from this premise, it sets forth a provocative "alternative" history of the world that is as compellingly readable as any novel. **Destiny Disrupted** won the Northern California Book Award for Best General Nonfiction of 2009, and it has been translated into nine

languages, including Russian, Dutch, Indonesian, Korean, and Italian.






