Pai and Ed were there also, working the food pantry. It is good to see our members in the community demonstrating that "service is our prayer."




Speaking of our Jane. At the recent CASA Appreciation Dinner she was recognized with a certificate of appreciation for her four years of volunteer service to the organization.

Wisdom Seekers Book Group Meet on the 2nd and 4th Sundays From 9 to 10



In the tradition of Jane Goodall and Dian Fossey, Robert Sapolsky, a foremost science writer and recipient of a MacArthur Genius Grant, tells the mesmerizing story of his twenty-one years in remote Kenya with a troop of Savannah baboons.

"I had never planned to become a savanna baboon when I grew up; instead, I had always assumed I would become a mountain gorilla," writes Robert Sapolsky in this witty and riveting chronicle of a scientist's coming-of-age in remote Africa.

An exhilarating account of Sapolsky's twenty-one-year study of a troop of rambunctious baboons in Kenya, A Primate's Memoir interweaves serious scientific observations with wry commentary

about the challenges and pleasures of living in the wilds of the Serengeti — for man and beast alike. Over two decades, Sapolsky survives culinary atrocities, gunpoint encounters, and a surreal kidnapping, while witnessing the encroachment of the tourist mentality on the farthest vestiges of unspoiled Africa. As he conducts unprecedented physiological research on wild primates, he becomes evermore enamored of his subjects — unique and compelling characters in their own right — and he returns to them summer after summer, until tragedy finally prevents him.

This book views world history not from London, Paris and Rome but from Bagdad, Damascus and Cairo. "Destiny Disrupted, A History of the World Through Islamic Eyes" takes, as its point of departure, the following question: "What are the key events of world history and the



shape of the overall story if one assumes that the center of the world is not Europe but the Islamic heartland?

We expect to finish *Destiny Disrupted* in the next few sessions so that in January we will begin **"A Chosen Faith."** By John Buehrens and Forrest Church. "For those contemplating religious choices, Unitarian Universalism offers an appealing alternative to religious denominations that stress theological creeds over individual conviction and belief. In this new edition of the classic introductory text on Unitarian Universalism, which includes a revealing, entertaining foreword

by best-selling author Robert Fulghum (*All I Really Need to Know I Learned in Kindergarten*.) The authors, John Buehrens and Forrest Church, explore the many sources of the living tradition of their chosen faith."


