
Meet on the 1st and 3rd Sundays from 9am-10am

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Banana and Nut Cake from Ann Hair...Van Dyke (mother's family) recipe

- 1 ½ cups sugar
- 3/4 cups butter
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup bananas, mashed (about 3)
- 4 tablespoons milk
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 3/4 cups nut meats (I use pecans.)
- 1 ½ cups flour

Mix in the order given. Bake at 350F until center is done and cake pulls away from pan. Makes a loaf or layer cake.

St. Patrick's Day with a Twist! Recipes from Eileen Martinez

Guinness Corned Beef

~4 lb. Corned Beef Brisket 12 oz. Irish Stout (i.e.Guinness)

1 c. Brown Sugar

Seasoning packet that comes with the corned beef

Instructions:

Rinse the beef and pat dry. Place in large crockpot, fat side up. Dump brown sugar and season packet on top of meat and then pour the stout over the top. (Feel free to use an extra bottle of stout or water to make sure the meat is covered). Put it on high for a half hour, then turn down to low and cook it for ~18 hours (overnight). Remove the corned beef from the liquid, and the fat on the top will slide right off, leaving you with fall-apart, amazing corned beef!

Bubble and Squeak

3 slices of bacon OR 3 Tbsp of butter

½ head of cabbage

1 large yellow onion (vidalias are great)

Instructions:

Fry up the bacon (or if you're using butter, skip that part). Remove the bacon to a paper towel to drain. Cut your cabbage in half – unless you have a huge pan, you won't be able to fit a whole chopped cabbage! Chop into 1" pieces, give or take. Dice the onion. Saute both in the bacon fat or butter until translucent. Salt and pepper to taste, and if you used bacon, chop it and toss it all together!

Candied Carrots with Tarragon

1 lb. Carrots

1/4 c. brown sugar

3 Tbsp. Butter

1-2 tsp. Tarragon to taste

Instructions:

Chop the carrots how you like, I prefer to cut them into small strips, but you can dime chop or dice them too. Cook carrots in butter until softened, stir in brown sugar and sprinkle with tarragon.

Garlic Mashed Potatoes

3 lbs. Russet or Yukon Gold Potatoes

5 cloves garlic (peeled and woody end removed)

½ pint sour cream

1/4 c heavy whipping cream

½ stick butter

Instructions:

Peel potatoes (you can leave yukon skin on if you like) and place in a large pot with enough water to cover. Throw in garlic as well. Boil until potatoes can be pulled apart easily with a fork. Drain the potatoes in a colander, and mash or use a blender to smash them. Stir in butter until melted and then add sour cream and whipping cream until you have the desired consistency. Mix in dill weed or chopped chives if you like.
