CHURCH MEMBER'S RECIPE

Curry Chicken and Rice

4 chicken breasts (cut up in small pieces)

2 celery stalks (cut up)

½ large onion or one small onion

1 apple

1 cup croutons

½ cup raisins

½ cup apple juice (more if you like a stew instead of chutney)

2 teaspoons of curry powder (more if you really like curry)

Salt and pepper to taste

2 teaspoons of brown sugar

Directions: Cut up chicken breasts into bite size pieces. Place in crockpot on high setting. Mix together croutons, curry, brown sugar, raisins, chopped up celery, and onion. Place in crockpot on top of chicken. Add apple juice. Place lid on crockpot. Cook on high 2 to 3 hours or 6 hours on low. Make rice 20 minutes before ready to serve. Serve curry chicken over rice.

SPOTLIGHT ON CHURCH MEMBER



Our very talented Rebecca Bingham plays the piano and cello, officiates wedding, teaches social media workshops, and

travels the world as a professional travel writer. She firmly believes that staying perpetually curious prevents burnout and fuels a zest for life.

Rebecca grew up in Monroe, Louisiana where music filled the family home. Her father, having earned in doctorate in choral education from Vanderbilt, taught music and conducted choirs at two state universities, and sang operas professionally in major cities throughout the South and Southwest. Her mother, an organ and piano major at Agnes Scott College and the University of Tennessee, taught private piano and children's choirs until Rebecca and her siblings went away to school.


Because of her love of music and a desire to help people, Rebecca earned an orchestra scholarship from the Louisiana State University, where she also studied probation and parole. After her graduation, she worked as the marketing and public Relations director for City of Faith, a group of half-way houses in LA and AR--- a job which opened the door to her writing career.

Inspired by the courage and determination of halfway houses residents, Rebecca emailed anonymous versions of their stories to family and friends. She wrote about the stories behind the inmates at the half-way house. The editor of the local paper found the stories compelling enough to hire Rebecca as a stringer to business profiles. In 2002, Rebecca expanded her freelance work with the newspaper to include a monthly travel column. Since then, her writing has been

featured in hundreds of articles for national and international publications.

Rebecca parlayed her love of music into another part-time business during college. Whenever her own string quartet was already booked for a date, clients asked her to recommend someone else. To meet their needs, Rebecca started her own business contracting regional musicians for wedding d special events. She now represents nearly 100 performing artists in Arkansas.

Rebecca is currently writing a book entitled, Finding Home: Finding Comfort in a World of Chaos. She recently became a UU member of our church, where we are lucky to share her talent. Welcome, Rebecca!
